

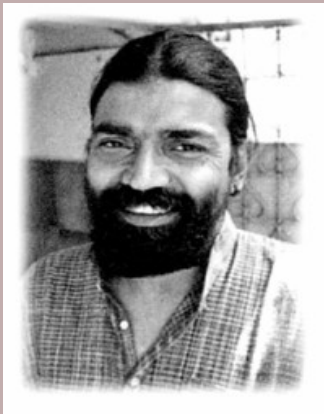

**On December 3rd 1984, over 40 tons of highly poisonous gas leaked out of the pesticide factory of Union Carbide in Bhopal, India. 8,000 people died in the worst chemical disaster in the history of humankind - and since then 20,000 have died from after-effects.**

**The film 'Bhopal Express' is a human drama set against the tragedy, through the eyes of a newly wed couple and their friend. Starring Naseeruddin Shah, Zeenat Aman, directed by Mahesh Mathai.**

**Satinath Sarangi arrived in Bhopal two days after the gas leak, and stayed on. He is the managing trustee of the Sambhavna Clinic which provides survivors free medical care and undertakes community health work. The clinic is the only organization researching the long-term effects of the Bhopal gas exposure. Sarangi has been involved with multiple activities run by a network of local, national and international groups, pursuing health and economic needs, fighting legal claims, providing medical support and reminding the world that Bhopal happened.**
